The mandate of CSA is to advise the Board on scientific matters related to IOF and its objectives to further clinical and basic research. Particular emphasis is placed on the international dimensions of policy and practice in the care of osteoporosis and musculoskeletal disorders. The scientific accuracy


of all IOF communications is verified by CSA, which also establishes working groups and conducts research projects according to need and the interests and expertise of the membership.

Watch and listen to the video of people living with osteoporosis share their personal stories of diagnosis and living with the disease.






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New Award Available in 2017




Osteoporosis Canada is pleased to provide a research studentship award to support training of a M.Sc. or Ph.D. candidate. This studentship research award is for direct support of the candidate and is not to be used to fund the actual research project. The candidate is expected to have an exceptionally high potential for future research achievement and productivity. The maximum amount of the single award is \$10,000 for one year, subject to availability of funds. OC reserves the right to not fund at one or both levels if no suitable candidates apply. OC aims to fund one M.Sc. and one Ph.D., yet may fund two M.Sc. or two Ph.D. awards depending on strength of the applications relative to stage of career.
